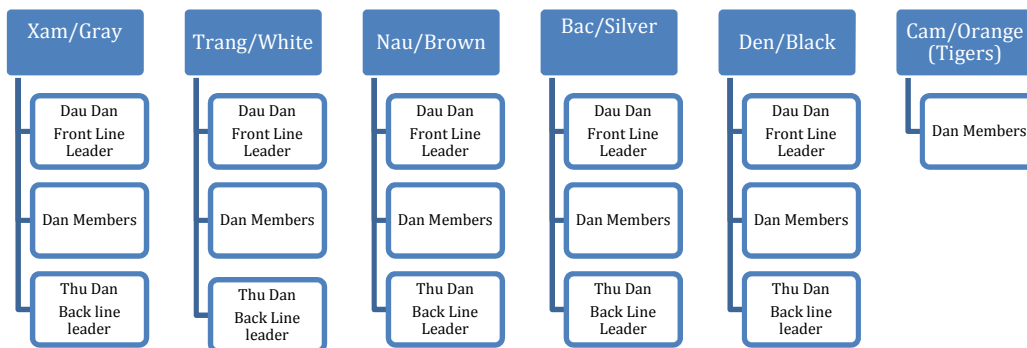
General Introduction

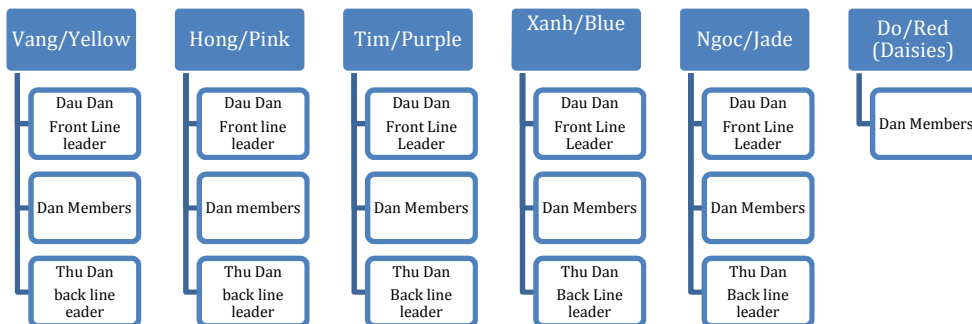
I. Organization:

➤ Ấu Đoàn Chi Lăng was founded in 1996 consisting of two packs:

▪ Lạc Long for Boys



Ấu Cơ for Girls

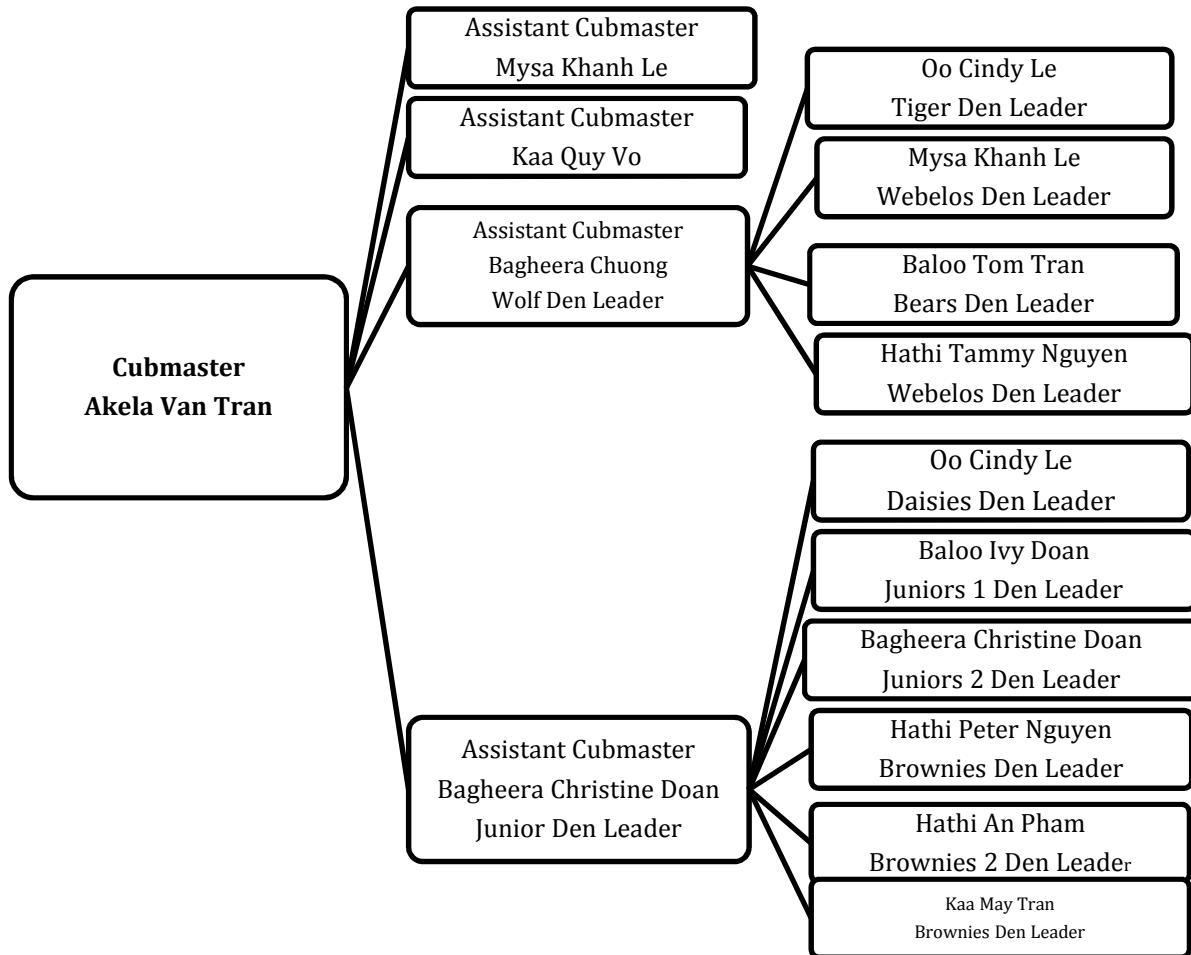


➤ The Ấu Đoàn branch is for any youth with age ranging from 6 to 10 years old (or from kindergarteners to 5th graders), registered under the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) and Girl Scout of USA (GSUSA).

➤ Ấu Đoàn is organized based on the Jungle Book characters for the Vietnamese portion of our program, and the Truong are referred to as Soi Gia, and Au Sinh are referred to as Soi Con.

- Each individual scout is a member of a patrol (referred to as Đàn , led by the Dau Dan and Thu Dan), altogether formed a pack, under the guidance of Cubscoutmaster -Akela who are assisted by Truong Au Doan, each has a Jungle Book character name (from the Jungle Animal Council in the story).
- We recommend watching the movie Jungle Book Story either the new live action movie or the cartoon version so the kids are familiar with the story.

II. Goals:

Provide guidance to the scouts through the advancement programs to:

1. Involve with outdoor activities, get familiar with the outdoor environment plus learning and practicing the basic tasks necessary for the daily life at home and in the community.
2. Learn the scout skills and involve in the outdoor activities such as camping and hiking.
3. Have the opportunities to keep their body fit, expand their knowledge, and develop their leadership skills.
4. Study/train with a team spirit, be familiar with the organization structures and disciplines.
5. Encourage the youths to study hard and live with Luat Rung and Luat Bay

III. Advancement Program:

Parents will help teach the scouts at home before the Scoutmaster and Assistant Scoutmasters test them. Except for the items reserved for the parents to sign, all the rest of the items must be tested and signed off by the Scoutmaster and Assistant Scoutmasters.

IV. Scout Responsibility:

1. Show up at the meeting regularly, on time, and with complete uniform.
2. Bring all studying materials: binder, notebook, pen/pencil, etc.
3. Bring water bottle.
4. Bring a hat
5. Bring a snack
6. Study the materials before the meeting.
7. Do a good turn and following the scout laws and oath.
8. Try to speak in Vietnamese when having a conversation with a Vietnamese.
9. Adhere to Lien Doan 3-Buddy system safety rule (always have an adult accompanying as well)
10. Inform Akela and/or your Soi Gia/Truong when coming late or leaving early to meeting or other activities.

V. Parent Responsibility:

1. Complete Youth Protection Training <https://www.scouting.org/training/youth-protection/>
2. Complete and pay the annual registration documents and fees.
3. Complete all event permission slips for Au Doan activities in a timely manner.
4. Update all medical insurance information/contact information whenever there's a change
5. Check emails regularly for all announcements from Au Truong (There will be weekly meeting agenda email)
6. Be presence with your children at all meeting or events in accordance with the BSA and GUSA rules and regulations.
7. Attend the monthly meeting with the Parent Association.
8. Assist the child/children with the study materials before they are being tested by the leaders.
9. Bring the child/children to the meeting regularly and on time.
10. Encourage the child/children to participate and earn the badges/loop belts/and Vietnamese Program
11. Notify the leaders of any absences or leave.
12. Help the child/children understand and follow the rules of Au Doan and Liên Đoàn.
13. Au Truongs encourage all parents to volunteer their time in various aspect of Au Doan program when call upon. We appreciate all your support.
